### LOCATION

Ocho Rios, where the Beaches Boscobel Resort and Golf Club Hotel is situated, is a coastal town placed in the parish of Saint Ann. The famous waterfall of Dunn's River can be reached by a 25 minute drive from the hotel.

Some of the other attractions in the area include the Rose Hall Plantation, Montego Bay Marine Park, Gallery of West Indian Art, Old Fort and Crafts Market, Blue Mountains National Park, and Bob Marley Museum and Recording Studio.

### PROPERTY AMENITIES

- \* Bayside Restaurant - Open-air restaurant with bleached-wood ceiling. Breakfast, lunch, dinner buffets of International cuisine. Open also for snack foods from late night until breakfast service begins. Dinner dress code: Resort evening.
- \* Arizona - Open-air seating on wood oceanview terrace. Open for burgers, hot dogs, and snack foods from late morning to late afternoon. Reopens evenings (closed Fridays) for Tex-Mex cuisine. Dinner dress code: Resort evening.
- \* The Venetian - Air-conditioned restaurant with Italian frescoed walls, vaulted ceilings, green-and-white table linens. Open for dinner only (closed Tuesdays). A la carte Italian menu. Dress code: Resort evening.
- \* Eleanor's - Air-conditioned white-glove service restaurant for adults only. Caribbean cuisine. Open for dinner only (closed Thursday). Nonsmoking. Dress code: Resort evening.
- \* BBQ Park - Casual open-air spot serving barbecue favorites, sandwiches, pizza, and daily specials from late morning to early evening.
- \* Arizona Beach Grill - Open late morning until late afternoon with jerk burgers, grilled dishes, and daily specials.
- \* Day and night activity includes beach and pool games and contests, night disco dancing, stage shows featuring the talents of guests, and lots of music, including jazz and Caribbean rhythms.
- \* A full-service spa featuring couples' rooms and sauna and steam rooms offers massage, reflexology, body wraps and scrubs, facials, waxing, hair braiding, paraffin treatments, and hair and nail care.
- \* A fitness center contains cardio and weight machines as well as free weights and offers aerobics and yoga classes. Guests can head to a rooftop sanctuary for spa treatments or dinner by candlelight. An afternoon tea is available near the Bayside Bar (except Mondays).

### ROOM AMENITIES

\* Beaches Boscobel Resort and Golf Club All Inclusive offers 224 guestrooms and suites in two five-story buildings and one three-story building--all painted pastel colors. There are no elevators in one of the five-story buildings, but other elevators on the steeply terraced property ensure guests have to climb a maximum of three flights of stairs to reach rooms or suites. Ceiling fans provide cooling alternatives to room air conditioning. Radios and televisions offering U.S. channels supply entertainment. Decor features pastel walls, tile floors, bright floral fabrics, and mahogany-stained furniture.
