

## **Royal Wedding in India**

## **The Romance of a Traditional Hindu Wedding**

### **The Pre—Wedding Ceremony**

Mehendi (special henna colouring applied in intricate, beautiful patterns on the hands) of the bride and the guests. A special Sangeet (Indian wedding songs) can be arranged.



### **Wedding Procession**

A traditional "Baraat" or procession starts from the hotel's gates of the hotel. The bridegroom sits on a beautifully decorated horse, and is escorted camels and elephants. Folk dancers and girls welcome the couple with a traditional dance, fireworks and a special "Buggi" (horse driven cart), escorting them into the main garden for the wedding.

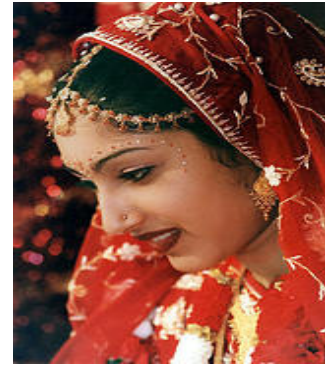
### **The Wedding Ceremony**

The priest conducts the special Hindu wedding ceremony in front of a "havan" or small fire, speaking ancient chants and blessing the wedding. An Indian music group plays traditional Indian music in the background. Includes a framed wedding certificate, a bottle of champagne, and a wedding cake after the wedding. Photography and wedding video can be arranged.



### **Post—Wedding Ceremony**

The couple and their guests enjoy a delicious special dinner amidst the lush palace gardens. The couple takes a short "Buggi" ride, with a glass of champagne and join the group at the gardens for dinner. An extravagant Rajasthani meal is on special silver "thalis" (plates) and a traditional Rajasthani dance is performed, followed by live Indian classical music.



### **Description of the Royal Wedding**

The wedding party of the bridegroom arrive with a stunning tableau of elaborately caparisoned regalia of Elephants, camels, lines of soldiers mounted on horses ,A band of musicians, men holding oil torches, with an environment of pomp and color the guests lead to the entrance of the palace. Here girls dressed in Rajasthani costumes sprinkle rose water and shower raised petals on the guests. The waiting brides family receives the guests & traditional welcome is held.

The bridegroom dressed in his Rajasthani wedding attire carrying a sword arrives along with wedding party on the Elephant he is accorded a special welcome the moment he enters the palace. The bride arrives from the front steps of the Palace carrying a garland with girls accompanying her.

The Bride and the Bridegroom then change garlands with showering fireworks. The wedding ceremony is performed under a pavilion. (we call it Mandap for Pheras)

After the Pheras there will be cake-cutting ceremony with Champagne toast and Fireworks After that they shall proceed for Dances and Dinner

The dinner is preceded with a folk dance program during which the best of artists



who have performed internationally display their art and skills. The guests are served snacks during the folk entertainment program.

After the entertainment guests are served with a lavish buffet Dinner

The guests are served Tea and coffee with Puppet show and finally a royal see off is accorded.

### ***The items included:***

- exotic Flower Decoration at the wedding venue and 2 main courtyards,
- floral decoration of mandap with some multi coloured rangolis in the courtyards
- illumination of the Palace with Fairy lights and Amber lights in the lawns and the Fort,



- decoration of the chosen venue by natural lights candles etc.
  - floral décor of the bridal room,
  - priest and pooja materials,
  - one well decorated Elephant for Bride Groom,
  - four Camels well decorated,
  - torch bearers,
  - local band for the procession,
  - Six Royal soldiers,
  - bagpiper Music,
  - milni garlands and Jaimala,
  - Welcome fire works at the main entrance of the palace,
  - royal welcome at palace with Red carpet laid up on the stairs Torches lit up,
- decorated camels and horses, drum beaters, showering of flower petals and arti tikka garland by traditionally dressed up girls
  - Palanquin/Carriage at the time of Bidai (Departure time),
  - wedding banquet dinner at Palace includes folk dances and gala fire works.
